

## The American Rescue Plan Difference for Wisconsin

Unemployment Rate: <u>Wisconsin's unemployment rate has fallen from</u> 3.8% in January to 3.0% in November, tying a record low.

Unemployment Claims: <u>Wisconsin unemployment claims are down 53%</u> <u>under Biden.</u>

Jobs Created: 55,700 jobs added in Wisconsin under Biden.

New Businesses Started: <u>18,810 New Businesses started in Wisconsin so</u> far this year.

Restaurants Kept Open: <u>Rescue Plan helped 2,091 Wisconsin</u> restaurants stay open – with an average award of \$180,543 per restaurant.

Economic Impact Payments: <u>Wisconsin families received 2.9 million</u> <u>Economic Impact Payments – \$7.1 billion in direct relief.</u>

Monthly Child Tax Credit: <u>Monthly CTC payments for Wisconsin</u> families of 1,062,000 children – with an average monthly payment for each family of \$457 – and \$1.6 billion total paid in monthly payments.

Reducing Health Insurance Costs: <u>Rescue plan saved Wisconsin ACA</u> <u>Marketplace Enrollees \$75 per month – reducing premiums by 50%.</u>

Funds for K-12 Schools: \$1.5 billion in relief to Wisconsin K-12 public schools – helping schools reopen and address Learning Loss.

State and Local Fiscal Support: <u>Rescue Plan is providing Wisconsin</u> <u>state and local governments with \$4.9 billion in fiscal relief.</u>
